Manduvira Sugar Co-operative Ltd was set up in order to support small farmers who did not have guaranteed markets for their products and had difficulty with the sale of their products. Fair trade gives them the opportunity to develop a sense of dignity and increase their standard of living. “Thanks to fair trade, the farmers have more motivation and they are returning to caring for their land. They can now improve the standard of living for their families and the community, and ensure more education for their sons and daughters. This is an association of more than 100 coffee co-operatives in the Oromia region of southern and central Ethiopia. Members enjoy good prices and a share of profits, which together increase household incomes, while fair trade premiums are also received and put towards schools, medical centres and water improvement projects for the benefit of their wider communities.

“When we sell coffee to the auction we only get the first payment and it stops there but when we sell it to the Union there are many advantages. One of these is that our children get access to the school in the village whereas before they had to travel long distances to study and this has meant many more children now go to school. - freshly roasted in Christchurch
- a smooth yet lively espresso blend designed for plungers, filter use or to be ground to fit your needs
- organic certified at source - organic production and cultivation carried out by our producers limits the impact on the environment

Instant Coffee Powder:

- Tanzanian coffee available in 100gm (organic) or 400gm (non organic)

•We also have medium ground 200gm single blend options suitable for plungers or filter machines.



Tea — the Healthy Alternative:

- loose (125gm) or tea bags - black tea (50 bags), plus green tea (50 bags) and rooibos (20 bags)
- our loose leaf black tea is one of the most sought after tea grades - Ceylon BOP (Broken Orange Pekoe)

- available in 300gm, 2kg and 5kg options
